History: Trinity Lutheran High School was founded in 2000 as a Christian high school in grades nine through twelve to serve south central Indiana. It is owned and operated by the South Central Lutheran Association for Secondary Education, Inc., a group of 16 Lutheran churches who provide financial and board leadership to the school. In the fall of 2001, Trinity first conducted classes in grades nine and ten, serving 15 students at First Baptist Church in Seymour. In January 2003,

the students moved into the permanent campus located on 41 acres in northern Jackson County, Indiana. The 50,000 square foot building includes ten classrooms with two science labs, a media center, dining hall, fitness center, and gymnasium. In May 2004, the first Trinity graduate received his diploma.

Trinity is a member of the Indiana High School Athletic Association and the Indiana State School Music Association.

School Instructional Program: Trinity's instructional program is designed for the college-prep student. Eight periods of courses are offered each semester with one day per week a block schedule of periods 1-4 and another day serves as a block day for periods 5 through 8. Most Trinity students pursue the Academic Honors Diploma or the Core-40 Diploma.

Diplomas Offered by Trinity Lutheran High School

General Diploma: 48 credits minimum, with 8 credits in Theology, 8 in English, 4 in Social Studies, 4 in Mathematics, 4 in Science, 1 in Health, 1 in Basic Physical Education, 2 in Fine Arts, and 12 credits from electives are standard requirements for all diplomas.

Core 40 Diploma: 48 credits minimum, with 8 credits in Theology, 8 in English, 6 in Social Studies (including 2 credits in U.S. History and at least 1 credit in U.S. Government, Economics, World History, or World Geography), 6 credits in Mathematics (including Algebra, Geometry, and Algebra II), 6 credits in Science (including Biology I, Chemistry I, or Physics I, plus an advanced course), 1 in Health, 1 in Basic Physical Education, 2 in Fine Arts, 8 credits in courses from the list below or the following: foreign languages, computer, and/or at least 6 credits in a logical sequence from a technical career area, and 2 to 4 more credits from any courses.

Academic Honors Diploma: 55 credits minimum with 8 credits in Theology, 8 in English, 6 in Social Studies, 8 in Mathematics (including Algebra, Geometry, Advanced Algebra, and Pre-Calculus), 6 in Science, 6 or 8 in Foreign Language, 1 in Health, 1 in Basic Physical Education, and 2 in Fine Arts. A student must maintain an 81% average and must not receive a grade less than 71% in any required course.
