- ✦ The first Resale Shop gift was given to Trinity in March 2006 for \$25,000. The total amount given to Trinity over the last 12 years is \$900,000.

The Lutheran SGO Program!

The Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Indiana is a separately incorporated, 501(c)(3) charitable organization, created to provide SGO scholarships to students of Lutheran schools in Indiana. Anyone who provides a donation to the Lutheran SGO and designates it for Trinity Lutheran High School will receive a **50% State tax credit** and provide a scholarship for qualified Trinity students that can be applied directly to the cost of tuition. This State tax credit is available to individuals or corporations who donate to the Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO) in the name of Trinity Lutheran High School from now until June 30, 2019, or until the credits run out (**usually in December**).

WHY PROVIDE AN SGO DONATION TO TRINITY LUTHERAN STUDENTS?


- ✦ The estimated cost to educate a student at Trinity is \$12,900 per person this year. Trinity reduces the tuition cost for every student by providing a scholarship of \$3,425 upon enrollment. Your contribution to the Lutheran SGO program in the name of Trinity will assist us in raising the money we need to grant the \$3,425 tuition scholarship to all our qualified students.
- ✦ Trinity students receive over 135 hours of theological instruction and 40 hours of worship time each year!
- ✦ Trinity offers over 72 college credits opportunities to our students!
- ✦ Trinity has received a Four-Star Rating by the Indiana Department of Education 3 of the last 4 years!
- ✦ Trinity has been given an “A” grade from the Indiana Department of Education the last 9 years!
