Lutheran SGO Program!

August marks the time when everyone in our Trinity family can provide a tuition assistance donation to our school through the Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO) and receive a **50% State tax credit** as well as provide scholarship money to qualified Trinity students. This State tax credit is available to individuals or corporations who donate to the Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization (SGO) in the name of Trinity Lutheran High School from now until June 30, 2019, or until the credits run out (**usually in December**).

Donations can be made in cash, check, money order, credit/debit card, IRA Required Minimum Distributions (RMD), publicly traded securities, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, grain (corn, soybean, wheat, etc), and livestock. WHY PROVIDE A LUTHERAN SGO DONATION TO TRINITY LUTHERAN HIGH SCHOOL?

The estimated cost to educate a student at Trinity this upcoming school year is \$12,900 per person. Trinity reduces the tuition cost for every student by providing a scholarship of \$3,425 upon enrollment. Your contribution to the Lutheran SGO program in the name of Trinity will assist us in raising the money we need to grant the \$3,425 tuition scholarship to all of our qualified students.
